

#### Highlights of 2019

Dave Cartwright was ranked 1<sup>st</sup> nationally in his age category over both the 10 Mile and Half Marathon distance, and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Marathon distance. He also represented England in the International Masters Half Marathon and will do so again in 2020.

Sean Hogan ran the London Marathon in a time of 02:24.07, beating our former club record set by Terry Cutler 36 years previously.

Robert Campbell Smith has shown that you can achieve anything, having joined us as a novice and gone on to compete in so many events for the club.

Neil Sexton achieved PBs in every traditional long distance event in 2019, with his Chester Marathon time earning him a selection to represent England as part of the England Masters Team in the Yorkshire Marathon.

Vicki Wicks achieved new PBs in races over 5 Miles, 10 Miles, Half Marathon, and Full Marathon, making her the 5<sup>th</sup> fastest female in our club history.

Sarah Swift also achieved PBs over 5km, 5 Miles, 10km, 10 Miles, Half Marathon and Full Marathon, including running both Boston and London Marathons within 13 days of each other (PBing at both!).
